CDBG Planning & Technical Assistance

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRASS VALLEY APPROVING APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING AND THE EXECUTION OF STANDARD AGREEMENTS AND ANY AMENDMENTS THERETO FROM THE PLANNING/TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE GENERAL ALLOCATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE STATE CDBG PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted the 2003-2009 Housing Element which contains an implementation plan aimed at meeting Grass Valley's housing needs, and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted their goals and initiatives which focused on certain infrastructure and economic development efforts, including, but not limited to, the improvement of the City's circulation system, supporting business expansion, redeveloping priority infill areas within the Grass Valley Sphere of Influence such as the Loma Rica Ranch SDA & Industrial Park and the LaBarr Meadows Road / Southhill Village SDA areas, and maintaining Grass Valley as the economic hub,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Grass Valley, as follows:

1. The City Council has reviewed and hereby approves applications for up to \$140,000 for two planning/technical assistance grant applications. The City will request \$70,000 each for LaBarr Meadows Road / Southhill Village SDA Sewer Extension Feasibility Study, *and* Loma Rica Ranch SDA & Industrial Park Sewer Extension Feasibility Study. Each application will request funds of \$35,000 from the CDBG General Allocation component and \$35,000 from the Economic Development component.
2. The City Council has determined that federal Citizen Participation requirements were met during the development of this application.
3. The City Council hereby approves the use of program income funds for the required local cash match. Based upon previous year's CDBG local cash match requirements, the local cash match is anticipated to be \$17,500, for the General Allocation Grant activities and \$17,500 for the Economic Development activities for a total cash match of \$35,000. The City Council authorizes the use of program income funds for the local cash match up to 30% of amount being requested.
4. The City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to act on the City's behalf in all matters pertaining to this application.
5. If the applications are approved, the Mayor is authorized to enter into and sign the standard agreements and any subsequent amendments with the State of California for the purposes of these grants.
