LOCATION: All three workshops will be at the L.O.V.E. Building in
Condon Park, 660 Minnie Street, Grass Valley

Format of Workshop: While the primary purpose of the outreach program is to provide information to the interested public, questions and comments will also be welcomed. For all three meetings, the public will be given an opportunity to ask questions about the environmental setting and/or regulations affecting the project in order to gain a better understanding as to how the EIR will assess the project and its potential impacts.
