

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC REVIEW PERIOD AND AVAILABILITY  
OF THE  
DRAFT STREET SYSTEM MASTER PLAN FOR THE CITY OF GRASS VALLEY**

The City of Grass Valley has completed a Street System Master Plan (SSMP) which contains a description of our existing and future traffic conditions along with a corresponding series of alternatives for how the problem areas can be fixed. The SSMP looks at only those areas lying within the Grass Valley City limits and its Sphere of Influence. The Plan assumes that Grass Valley will grow in a manner and at a rate consistent with the current 2020 General Plan. The goals of SSMP are: 1) To identify existing and future transportation deficiencies taking place within the next 20 years; 2) To document all mitigation measures in City and Regional Capital Improvement Programs (CIP) needed to achieve a Level of Service (LOS) D or better conditions in system; 3) To develop street and intersection design standards and policies which address existing conditions, topography and pedestrian / bicycle access needs; 4) To develop a monitoring system to periodically check the LOS status of all critical intersections and streets; 5) To develop planning level cost estimates on all mitigations; and, 6) To develop a list of present and future funding sources.

Copies of the SSMP are available for public review during regular business hours at the Nevada County Library, 980 Helling Way, Nevada City, the Grass Valley Library, 207 Mill Street, Grass Valley, and the Grass Valley City Hall at 125 E. Main Street in Grass Valley. The SSMP is also available on the City's website at [www.cityofgrassvalley.com](http://www.cityofgrassvalley.com).

The public review period for the SSMP extends for a 30-day public review period from **August 20, 2004 to September 20, 2004**. All interested persons are invited to send written comments prior to the expiration of the public comment period on **September 20** to:
